(EPSDT) is often called "well-child
checkup" because it means that
you and your child's primary care
provider are working to keep your
child healthy and well.

Some of the well-child services offered:

- Physical exam
- Vision/hearing screenings
- Growth and development
- Nutrition
- Immunizations (vaccines)
- Dental (starting in toddler years)
