ARHOME Medicaid 1115 Waiver Demonstration

- 1. Improve health outcomes among Arkansans in:
 - Maternal and infant health
 - Rural health
 - Behavioral health
 - Chronic disease
- 2. Provide opportunities to **reduce poverty** through employment, education, and training.
- **3. Slow the growth in spending** for ARHOME while maintaining the economic and fiscal benefits of coverage through Qualified Health Plans.



Life360 HOME Concept

The concept: DHS contracts with hospitals to provide intensive care coordination for ARHOME enrollees most at risk

Three types of Life360 HOMES, but today's focus:
✓ Maternal: home visiting services to women with high-risk pregnancies

All medical services continue to be provided through QHP or traditional Medicaid; Life360s provide supplemental supports only.




Maternal Life360: Concept

- Life360 HOME (hospital) contracts with evidence-based home visiting provider to provide home visiting services to women with high-risk pregnancies.
- Must include SDOH screening and referrals.
- Home-visiting program provides services for up to two years after baby's birth (one year for non-ARHOME beneficiaries)
- ARHOME beneficiaries can continue to receive Life360 services even if they disenroll from Medicaid (does not apply to participants in other Medicaid programs).
- Participation of non-ARHOME women is pending CMS approval.



Maternal Life360: Beneficiary Eligibility

- Beneficiaries are eligible if they:
 - Are enrolled in ARHOME or another Medicaid program
 - Have high-risk pregnancy diagnosis and are pregnant at the time of enrollment
 - Live in the Life360 service area
 - Are not already receiving home-visiting services
- About 12,500 women on Medicaid diagnosed with highrisk pregnancy in 2021








Maternal Life360: Provider Criteria

- Hospitals with obstetrics unit
 - 39 AR hospitals eligible
- Can be hospital in bordering state







4 evidence-based home visiting programs in AR Currently operate in 38 counties and parts of another 4

Maternal Life360: Monitoring Metrics

- Home visits
- Person-Centered Action Plan Milestone Achievement
- PCP assigned, hospital admissions and re-admissions, emergent and non-emergent ED visits
- Prenatal visits
- C-sections
- Live birth
- Pre-term/term
- Birthweight
- NICU stay
- EPSDT visits
- Postpartum contraceptive care

Implementation Checklist

- CMS approved waiver amendment to include Life360 HOME program
- Promulgated Life360 HOME manual (state rules for the program)
- ✓ DHS submitted state plan amendment to allow non-ARHOME women to participate in Maternal Life360 HOME; awaiting CMS approval
- DHS submitted CMS-required planning documents (implementation plan, beneficiary eligibility assessment protocol, etc.); awaiting CMS approval



Experience so far...


Maternal:

- DHS has approved seven Letters of Intent (although one decided against moving forward) and is reviewing three applications
- Counties include Pulaski, Saline, Independence, Craighead, Faulkner
- Some have partnered with existing home visiting programs; others want to start new programs with their own staff.
