New Metrics	Description		
Tobacco Usage	Percentage of patients aged 12 years and older who were screened for tobacco use one or more times during the measurement period AND who received tobacco cessation intervention during the measurement period or in the six months prior to the measurement period if identified as a tobacco user (All payer source). (eCQM CMS138v13)		
Avoidance of Antibiotic Treatment for Acute Bronchitis/Bronchiolitis	The percentage of episodes for members 3 months of age and older with a diagnosis of acute bronchitis/bronchiolitis that did not result in an antibiotic dispensing event.		
Maternal Depression Screening	Percentage of those who have given birth in the past 12 months who have a paid Depression Screening claim billed either to the Mother's Medicaid ID or the Child's Medicaid ID.		
Lead Screening	Percentage of children 2 years of age who had one or more capillary or venous lead blood test for lead poisoning by their second birthday.
